

Rules of the Game release process





- rule changes only every **even** year
- mid-term updates every odd year just clarifications and error corrections
- rule book releases one year in advance (initial release)
- "last minute" clarifications and error corrections on rule book possible prior to release (final release)

8.10 Foul Play

Certain rules allow the referees to base their discretion on the **recklessness** of an action. Such assessment of **reckless endangerment** shall be based on the severity of the infraction, severity of the contact, the degree of violence and the general reprehensibility involved.

- Does not contradict any other rule not mentioned for change in the proposal
- Is consistent with the notion of the game
- Meets the current standards of the Rules of the Game
- Makes playing the game more secure for all participants
