

New point 17 in IISHF Constitution

“Regulations Committee”

- 17.1 The Regulations Committee shall consist as a composition of Delegates of all National Member Associations (NMAs).
- 17.2 The Regulations Committee shall have the power
- to propose any changes to the IISHF Regulations
 - to vote on proposals of NMAs to the IISHF Regulations received not later than four (4) months prior to the General Meeting by a NMA in line with article 11.7 IISHF Constitution for final vote to the IISHF Council of Members.
- 17.3. Each NMA shall appoint one Delegate to the Regulations Committee and report this delegate to the IISHF Presidium. As long as a National Member Association has not reported another delegate, the last notified delegate is valid.
- 17.4. The Regulations Committee shall be led by a chairman and a vice chairman. Both persons must be a member of the Regulations Committee and shall be elected by the Council of Members at the AGM. Persons nominated for chairman or vice chairman on the Regulations Committee must be present at the AGM or must have notified the IISHF Presidium in writing prior to the AGM that they are willing to be elected. The Election for the Regulations Committee shall have a two (2) year term.
- 17.5. Each Regulations Committee Member has the right to vote in line with the voting rights of his NMA according to article 11.11 – 11.14 IISHF Constitution. A quorum for a vote of the Regulations Committee shall consist of no less than one third (1/3) of the members of the Regulations Committee. All proposals/decisions of the Regulations Committee shall be taken by simple majority of the votes cast. If a Regulations Committee Member does not respond within the given time (minimum 14 days) this will be taken as an Abstention from that vote. Abstentions do not count. In the event of a tied vote to a proposal/decision of Regulations Committee, the Chairman of the Regulations Committee shall have the casting vote.
- 17.6 The Regulations Committee can appoint maximum 3 additional persons to their committee in advisory role and without any voting right.
